1st Vice's Report

To start off, I want to thank everyone for their patience during the first few weeks of the 2023 membership campaign. Typically, cards are delivered to the post prior to the July 1st kickoff. This year we didn't receive the cards until nearly the end of July due to an issue with the printer at the national level, which got us off to a slow start. I also want to apologize for the additional delay on my end. Life sometimes has a way of getting in the way, and I was not able to start processing membership until the weekend of August 20th my sincere apologies for the extra wait. That said, I processed 95 renewals and new memberships that weekend alone! The following week I processed an additional eight, so we are already above 100 renewals for 2023. To put that into perspective, our goal for the entirety of 2023 is 264, so we are nearly half way there already! That is truly incredible! Thank you all so much for those who have already renewed! Those of you who haven't, I have all the new cards and I have managed to beat life back (for now), so please send in your dues! I would love to see us blow through the monthly goals from District this year-especially since we ended up four short for our total goal last year. It would be a great way to rebound from that.

I also want to ask everyone to please continue your recruitment efforts to bring in new members. Remember, we pay the first year's dues for any new active duty member so there is no cost for them to give us a try and see what the Legion has to offer! I would also ask/beg that you please have applicants pay close attention to the new membership application. Most of the applications I receive have either incomplete or illegible information on them. Oddly enough, most don't even check what branch of the military they served in! Also, please remember I need to verify an applicant's DD214 or current active-duty status in order to issue them a membership. This is an incredibly important step! Signing off as a recruiter is not enough! The recruiter block is not an "honor system" or for vouching for someone's eligibility, it is only to track our members who assist in bringing in new membership so that they can be recognized. By all means, please PRINT the recruiter's name legibly so that I can read it and give you the credit you deserve as the membership year goes on. However, I still need to see the required proof of eligibility! This is a national requirement.

Also, we have had several requests for transfers to our post-and why not? We are pretty awesome! However, I typically have been getting just a handwritten note in the membership bag. Sometimes it includes the information I need like current post number or membership number, and sometimes it doesn't. If you know someone who wants to transfer, please have them see the club manager or bartender on duty to pick up a "Member Data Form" to fill out. If they are an instate member, I can only transfer them myself if they are paying their dues for the upcoming year-but I still need all the info on that form. If they have already paid up their dues or are transferring from out of state, I need to be able to send their SIGNED Member Data form to Richmond for processing. I cannot process any other transfers myself unless it is a renewal of dues for a member at another Virginia post. There have been a couple of transfer requests that I have not been able to process or even contact because all I received was a name-no contact info, no POC from our post to follow up with, no membership number or current post number, etc. It could have been the difference in us meeting our goal last year, so please, see a staff member to ensure your applicant for new membership or

transfer has completed the required paperwork and provided the required documentation! Help me to help them!

Stepping off my soapbox, again I want to thank all of you for your continued membership and the very strong showing so far for the 2023 campaign! Lance Kent and I will be getting together soon to finalize plans for the early bird party, and with such a strong showing already I imagine it will be a great time! Make sure you get that stamp on your 2023 card so you don't miss out on the fun!
