1st Vice's Report

The Post started out extremely strong in pursuing our membership goals this year. We had nearly 60% of our TAL members renew between July and the end of September, which is outstanding! While we started off with a bang, things have since tapered off significantly.

Last year we met every membership milestone for 2022—until the very last one. We ended up falling short of our goal by only 4 members (again, thank you to all of our members who stuck with us in 2022, our new members and transfers who joined us, and especially those that have already renewed for 2023!).

Our goal for 2023 is 264 Legionnaires and we are currently standing at 190. Our December goal is 75% renewals, but we are falling short currently at 72%. By January we are expected to be at 80%.

We seem to be renewing at a much slower pace this year than last year, which is a bit concerning to me since we ended up falling short in 2022. Now that we are in our final push, if you haven't renewed your membership for 2023 please do so as soon as possible. If you know anyone who is eligible for Legion membership, please bring them in to show them what we have to offer. If you are considering allowing your membership to lapse for any reason, please reach out to me first so we can talk about your concerns and see if there is anything we can do.

Our members remain the lifeblood of our Legion. I'm hopeful that we can all continue to serve, support, and socialize together in 2023 and we can all help to recruit new members and transfers to keep our Post going strong. I wish a happy and safe holiday season, and a very healthy and Happy New Year, to each of you and your families!

If you need assistance applying for VA benefits from exposure to Camp Lejeune toxic water, please contact me. This also includes increases to your current VA benefits through a new claim. I can help you with this!

This is for health care and compensation benefits from VA, not the lawsuit advertised on TV.

If you think you are eligible or want to put in a new claim in addition to your existing VA benefits, give me a call at (703) 898-6627. If you are not sure, please go to this VA web link for more information: www.publichealth.va.gov/docs/exposures/CLPost er.pdf, or just call me and we will work together to figure it out.

As always, when applying for VA health care and compensation benefits, you will need your DD-214. If you cannot find yours, go to: https://www.archives.gov/veterans/military-service-records, or contact me to help you order it online together.

Remember, you are eligible for burial benefits; plots are free at national cemeteries and headstones are free at both national and private cemeteries.

Do your family a big favor and have your DD-214 available with your important papers.
