The 2024 membership year is ending soon. At the current time, our Squadron has a total renewal count of 107 members for the 2023 membership year. That's getting close to the Department goal of 128 members for our Post 1976 SAL Squadron, which Virginia increased significantly las year since we went a bit over last year's goal. As far as the events our chapter has been involved in, here are the current efforts we are involved in:

Several Riders and supporters from our chapter will be riding in the Virginia Legacy Run, which is a local run prior to the National American Legion Riders Legacy run held in the summer. The Virginia Legacy Run will be held in mid-June, and the Riders and supporters in our chapter will be in the northern region portion of this run.

In addition, the Riders have a small dinner on Thursday night, in conjunction with the Post's Queen of Hearts activity. It varies from week to week but is always a good meal.

We will be looking into things to do at the Post as additional fundraisers. With much warmer weather moving in, let's get out and ride. RIDE SAFE!
