

The American Legion has a long history of advocacy for our veterans, service members, and their families. As we enter into the fall season, let us not forget some of the more noteworthy accomplishments of the American Legion, to which we all belong.

On Nov. 11, 1921, American Legion leaders join Allied generals and president Warren G. Harding in ceremonies to dedicate the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier at Arlington National Cemetery. The tomb was the culmination of Legion-supported legislation introduced by U.S. Rep. Hamilton Fish Jr., a founder of the organization.

On Dec. 15, 1943, past national commander Harry W. Colmery starts to write in longhand, on Mayflower Hotel stationery in Washington, D.C., the first draft of what will later become the "GI Bill of Rights"—considered the Legion's single greatest legislative achievement.




